MOSQUITO OFFENSE

Mosquitoes carry Plasmodium falciparum malaria in Africa which is often resistant to old chloroquine drugs.

The Plasmodium Vivax malaria is often successfully treated with the older class drugs. There are four kinds of malaria

MOTHER AND CHILD DEFENSE

1. Destroy Mosquito habitat and standing water in and near the village.
2. Sleep under long-lasting insecticidal net (LLIN)
3. Ensure indoor residual spraying of insecticide (IRS)
4. Treat Malaria with new artemisinin base Combination Therapy (ACT)
5. Intermittent preventive Treatment in pregnancy (IPT)
6. Intermittent preventive Treatment in infants (IPTi)
